How species have come to be, adapt and disappear. Children will also begin to gain a concept of the earth's timeline and that amazing things existed long before they did. Children will be able to: - Use books and photographs to help understand the past. -Learn about the different periods: Jurassic, Triassic, Cretaceous and Extinct -Explore fossils -Discuss and explore what is similar/different between the periods and animals, make comparisons -Learn about carnivores/herbivores/omnivores and their diets – link to healthy eating -Learn about dinosaur movement, communication and body parts -Sorting and grouping animals -Life cycle (eggs) -Explore the habitats eg, swamp -Greek meaning of Dinosaur 'Terrible Lizzard' - Explore changing states of matter by freezing some dinosaur toys in ice. See where dinosaurs can escape the ice age the quickest! -Understand the effects on the changing seasons on the natural world	Key Learning: Learning about and comparing food and farming in the UK, locally and abroad. Looking at how food and farming have changed over time including markets, shows and shopping. Children will be able to: -Learn about types of farming -Talk about the link between food and farming - Compare farms in the UK and abroad and the differences between them (what they grow and why) -Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen on photos -Look at how farms/machinery has adapted and changed over time -Comment on images of familiar situations in the past -Focus on local farms/food events (experience a farm) -Understand the key features of the life cycle of a plant -Look at the crops on a farm and where these crops are best grown -Link to Healthy eating -Understand the key features of the life cycle of an animal (farm animals) -Look at and be able to match mother animals and their young -Understand the effects on the changing seasons on the natural world around them in particular on farms	Key Learning: Learning focused around traditional tales and nursery rhymes. Children will become familiar with tales and rhymes from the present and the past. Children will explore rhyme, morals and evolution of tales over time.
